

HUMA 110R: The Humanities in Western Culture

This interdisciplinary course in Western culture integrates the arts of literature, painting, music, sculpture, film, and the discipline of philosophy. To better understand why we are the way we are, our studies are centered on our cultural heritage, from Greece, early Christianity, and the Renaissance to the present day. Attention will be given to the following universal concepts in human thought: search for freedom, search for truth, search for beauty, identification with God, identification with the natural world, and relationship with society.
